SHANTI PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Shanti is a close-fitting long sleeve top. It features a faux wrap front, a deep V-shaped neckline, and a draped left side seam. The one-piece raglan sleeves are long, straight, close-fitting and have openings at the bottom. Shanti is above-hip length.



IMPORTANT!

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You may use Vikisews patterns for commercial use, to sew custom-made garments and/or create fashion collections, on the condition that the patterns are solely used in a manufacturing setting and are not further shared with individuals.

SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this long sleeve top, choose knit fabrics with the following properties:

- medium weight, soft, breathable, stretchy (stretch factor 2.2–2.5)
- the fiber content should include elastane or spandex and can also include natural fibers (wool, cotton), artificial fibers (viscose), blends (wool + polyester, cotton + polyester, etc.), and synthetics (polyester, microfiber, polyamide)
 - the following fabrics are recommended: knits

Attention! We recommend using only stretchy fabrics for this long sleeve top.

You can determine the stretch factor of your fabric yourself. To do this, mark 10 cm (4") along the crosswise grain of the fabric, lay a ruler next to the marked section and stretch the fabric. Divide the measurement you get by 10.

The long sleeve top in the photo is made of thin knit fabric. The fabric is medium weight, soft, and stretchy. The fiber content is a blend of viscose, polyester, microfiber, and spandex.

IMPORTANT! When purchasing fabric, please account for shrinkage and buy 5% more than required.

- 4. Straight-grain fusible stay tape, 1 cm (3/8") wide 0.5 m (1/2 yd)
- 5. Matching thread 5 spools (1 spool for the sewing machine + 4 spools for the overlocker)

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

- sewing machine for construction
- overlocker for construction and finishing raw edges. It can be replaced with a stretch overlock stitch or a zigzag stitch on the sewing machine (overlock or zigzag stitch width 2–3 mm, stitch length 2.5 mm)
- coverstitch or coverlock machine for finishing the garment hem. If you don't have a coverstitch machine, it can be replaced with a twin needle on any regular sewing machine that can do a zigzag stitch

IMPORTANT! We recommend using specialty needles when working with knit fabrics (for example, STRETCH, SUPER STRETCH, JERSEY, etc.). When sewing, a ball-shaped needle point pushes the knit loops apart without piercing the threads.



Match the dart legs on the wrong side of the left front piece and pin.

Important! Use a stretch or zigzag stitch on the sewing machine when stitching the dart to prevent pulling or distortion of the seam when stretching.



Set a 2.5 mm stitch length and a 2 mm stitch width on the sewing machine and stitch the dart using a stretch or zigzag stitch.

Backstitch at the raw edge only. Press the dart flat.



Tie the thread tails at the dart point into a knot and hide them inside the dart bulk using a needle.
